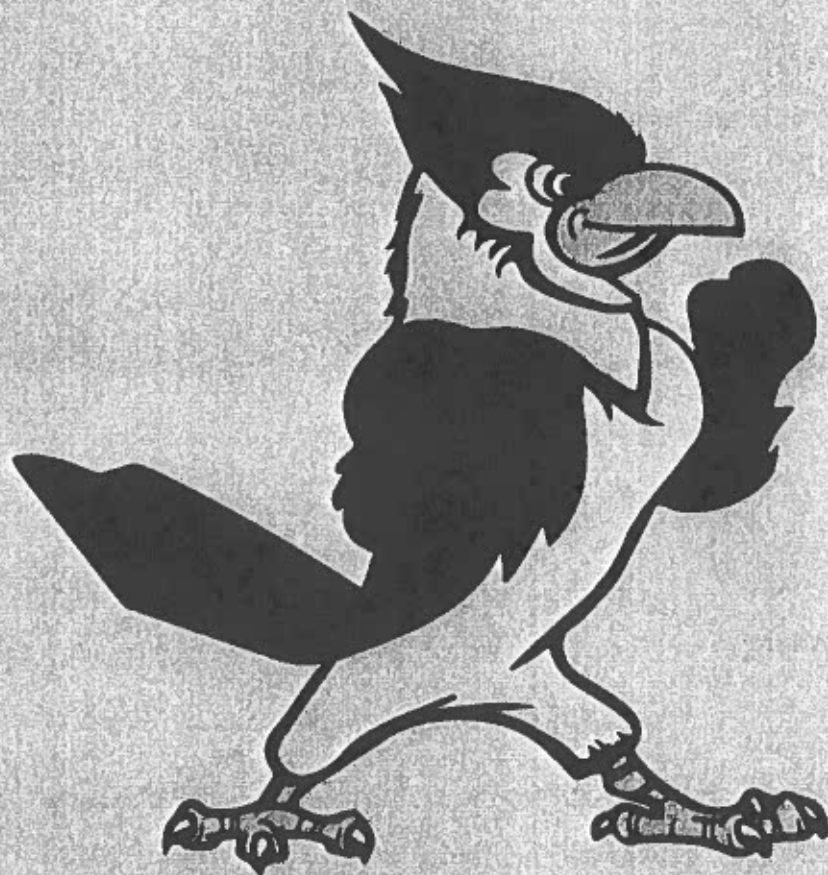

**Fred Lenig-Blue Jay Legacy**

Fred Lenig a 2011 retiree of the Central Columbia School District left his mark in education as well as athletics as he was employed at Central Columbia for 37 years as an educator and coach. Fred graduated from Lock Haven University in 1976 with a B.S. Degree in Health and Physical Education. While at Lock Haven in played three years of football where he held the record for the longest kickoff return in Division II football and participated in track & field for one year. Fred coached varsity football at Central Columbia as an assistant coach from 1981-2011. While coaching football he earned a 1981 Eastern Conference Championship and in 1992-1993 and 1994 District IV Championships. Fred also was the head coach of both the boys and girls Track & Field Teams (Boys-1984-1994) and (Girls-1996-2014). Fred accumulated a record with both teams at 164-97-6. He earned PHAC Championships in Track and Field in 2010, 2011 and 2014. He also earned a District IV Championship in 2014. He also coached numerous PIAA State Track & Field medalists including the 2014 PIAA Girls 4 X 100 relay champions. Fred coached, motivated and guided numerous athletes and students while working at Central Columbia. Fred had a knack for gathering the greatest talent and guiding them to success. Fred also was a great supporter of all the athletic programs at Central Columbia.

**Todd Cummings-Coach Induction**

Todd Cummings a 2019 retiree of the Central Columbia School District coached Wrestling for 30 years at Central Columbia. Todd was a wrestling team captain at Bloomsburg University where he captured an Eastern Wrestling League Championship, he was a two-time NCAA Division I qualifier, he recorded 95 career wins and was inducted in Bloomsburg University's Athletic Hall of Fame. Todd was employed as a special education instructor for 36 years at Central Columbia Middle School and also worked as an assistant wrestling coach at Central Columbia and then become the head coach at Central Columbia. While coaching Todd was able to generate a winning attitude within the wrestling program. This attitude grew and the success of the program grew as well. Under Todd Cummings many wrestlers become successful not only at the high school level but also at the post-secondary level as well. Through his coaching career Todd produced at 331-269 dual meet record with nine league championships, five sectional championships, two district championships, two state championships, 24 individual district champions, 20 individual regional champions, and 26 PIAA state medalists. Todd was inducted into the District IV Wrestling Hall of Fame honoring his dedication to the sport.

### **Hervey Gillespie**

Hervey Gillespie graduated from Central Columbia in 1969, he participated in Boys Tennis for two years while earning numerous varsity letters in this sport. Hervey was Central Columbia's first District IV Tennis Champion as well as Central Columbia's first ever State Tennis qualifier. In 1968, Hervey was the District IV Runner-Up and in 1969, he captured the District IV Individual Tennis Championship. Also, in both 1968 and 1969, Hervey competed in the state championship tournament where he finished in sixth place both years. He completed his tennis career at Central Columbia with an undefeated regular season match record. Hervey was awarded the Administration Award for his determination and dedication to a new sport at Central Columbia. Hervey has been a private business owner for 45 years in the Bloomsburg area and has assisted with promoting athletics at Central Columbia.

### **Richard Brandt**

Richard Brandt is a 1974 graduate of Central Columbia where he was an outstanding two-sport athlete. Richard excelled in cross country as well as track & field. He earned numerous varsity letters in four years of athletics here at Central Columbia. During his athletic career he was a four-year starter in both of his sports. In 1973, Richard earned the District IV Cross Country Championship while in 1974 he competed in the PIAA State Cross Country meet capturing a third-place finish. His best mile time was 4:32 and best half mile time was 2:14. Richard was a dominant cross country and distance runner during his high school career. He was an inspiring athlete to his teammates as well as younger individuals. He completed his senior year undefeated in the mile in track & field until his state final race where he finished in third place.

### **Jeremy Zeisloft**

Jeremy Zeisloft graduated in 1993 and was a varsity letter winner in Football, Soccer, Basketball and Baseball during his four-year athletic career at Central Columbia. In 1991, Jeremy was a member of the State Championship Baseball Team while in 1992 he played a major role in the District IV Football Championship. In 1993, Jeremy was a member of the PIAA state semi-finalist baseball team. Throughout his high school career, Jeremy exhibited the excellent athlete he was and for his efforts he was awarded numerous post season all-star selections for football and baseball. Jeremy demonstrated great work ethic and determination to accomplish his goals and well as strived to assist his fellow teammates in reaching their goals as well. Jeremy attended Susquehanna University where he earned a degree in Finance and currently lives in the Toledo, Ohio area.

### **Donald Scatena**

Donald Scatena graduated in 2011 and was a varsity letter winner in Boys Cross Country and Boys Track and Field for four years where he excelled in the distance and vaulting events. In 2011, Donald was the PIAA District IV double "AA" pole vault champion as well as the PIAA double "AA" State Track and Field Runner-Up competing in the pole vault. Donald vaulted 15'1" to capture the second-place finish at the state championship. He is the most accomplished pole vaulter in Central Columbia Boys Track and Field history. Donald was a multiple student/athlete award winner as well as an Academic Honors student. Donald also in 2011 was awarded the Coaches' Award for his determination to accomplish his goals and well as strived to assist his fellow teammates in reaching their goals as well. Donald attended Lehigh University where he earned a degree in Sociology and Anthropology. Donald is currently on the Central Columbia Track & Field Coaching Staff specializing on the pole vault.

### **Kurt Meske**

Kurt Meske graduated in 2012 and was a varsity letter winner in Boys Soccer, Wrestling and Boys Track and Field for four years where he excelled in each sport. In 2011 and 2012, Kurt was part of the Boys Soccer Teams that completed their seasons as the District IV Second Place Teams. In the 2011-2012 Wrestling season, Kurt earned a third-place state medal at the PIAA State Wrestling Tournament to cap off his high school wrestling career. Kurt was a multiple student/athlete award winner as well as an Academic Honors student. Kurt was also awarded the Coaches' Award for his determination to accomplish his goals as well as strived to assist his fellow teammates in reaching their goals as well.

### **2014 Girls Track & Field Team**

The 2014 Girls Track & Field Team captured the PHAC Championship as well as the District IV double A championship. This team completed the dual meet season with a 7-0 record with many outstanding performances throughout the season. 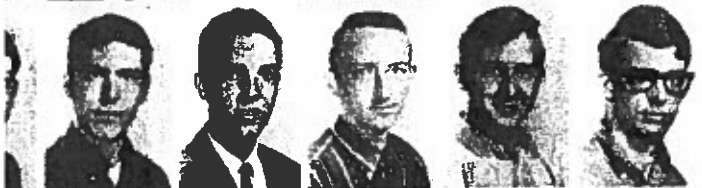

# WHS Shut Out 1st Time In Tennis; Gillespie Wins

Central Columbia's Hervey Gillespie gave a courageous performance to win the singles championship while Galston's John Nelson and Jim Campbell repeated as doubles champions Friday in the District Four Tennis Tournament at Bucknell University.

Gillespie avenged last year's loss to Galston's Dave Green in the district finals by coming from behind for a 3-6, 6-4, 6-7 victory over the Galston junior. Green was in match point five times in the deciding set, but Gillespie refused to surrender and captured the title.

Seventeen boys representing nine schools competed in the singles competition. Lewisburg's pair of Gordon and Woods were the semifinal victims of Green and Gillespie, respectively, who'll be competing in the FIAA Championships at Peru State next Saturday for the second straight year.

## 11 Teams

Nelson and Campbell defeated Middletown's Horvath and Phil Wagner 6-2, 1-6, 6-1, for their second straight district doubles crown. The competition among the 11 teams entered was single elimination because the teams were seeded with Nelson and Campbell placed No. 1 and Hunt-Wagner No. 3.

The second-seeded team, the Williamsport High School duo of Alan Stout and Dave Meckbach, which lost in the finals last year, bowed to Hunt and Wagner, 6-4, 9-7, in the semifinals. Montoursville's John Mazzanti and Cal Updegraff were the victims of Nelson and Campbell in the other semifinal match.

With the winner and runnerup in both singles and doubles ad-

vancing to FIAA competition, it marks the first year in history that Williamsport has been shut out of the state tournament. The Millionaires had swept both the singles and doubles every year before last, when their only representative was the runnerup double team of Stout and Meckbach.

The remainder of the baseball squad consists of much championship material. With a lot of hard work and desire, CHS can look forward to gaining league titles again in future years.

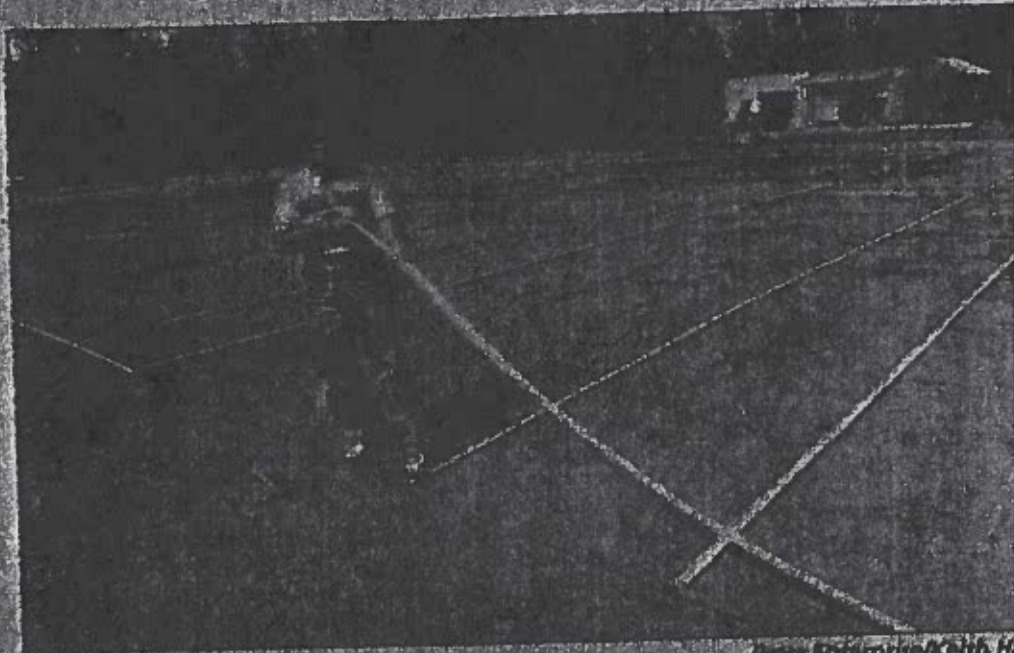


Pictured above is Herb Gillespie holding his runner's-up trophy, which he received at the District 4 meet at Bucknell.

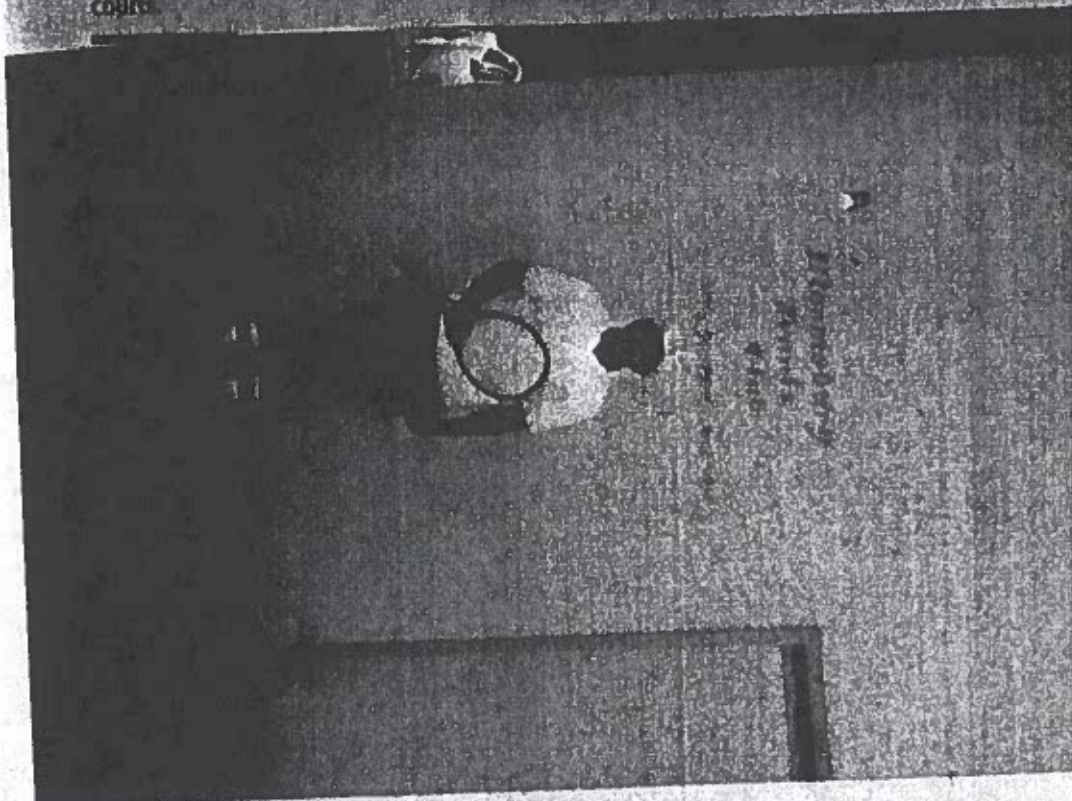

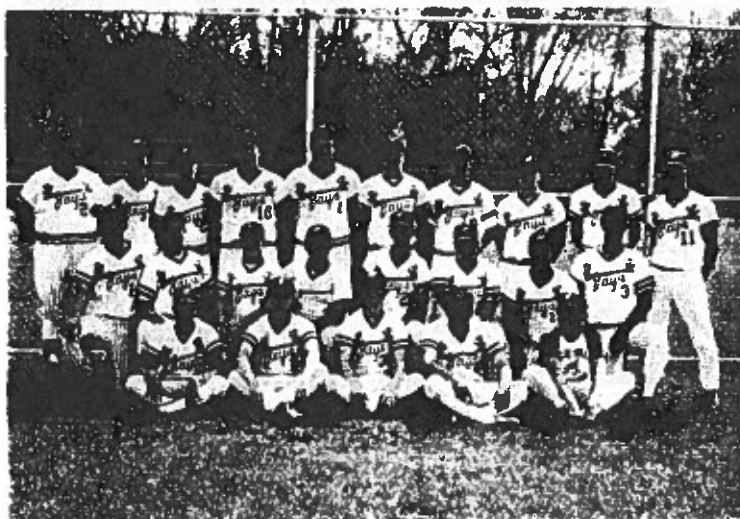

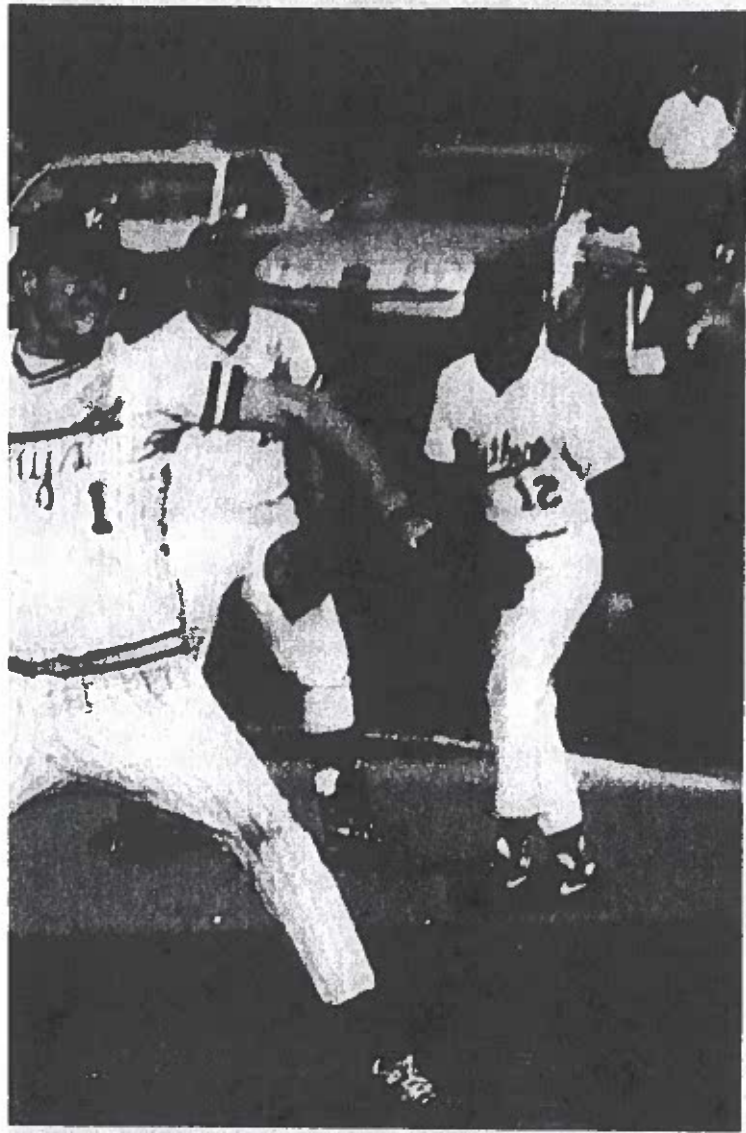

Central Columbia football has always meant Pride, Class, and Winning—those qualities endure.

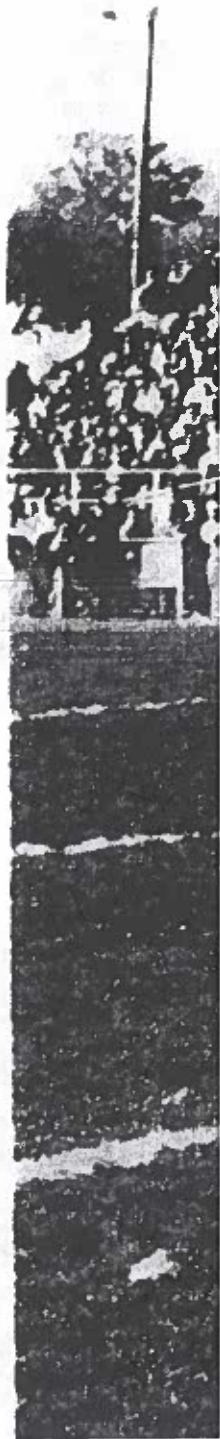
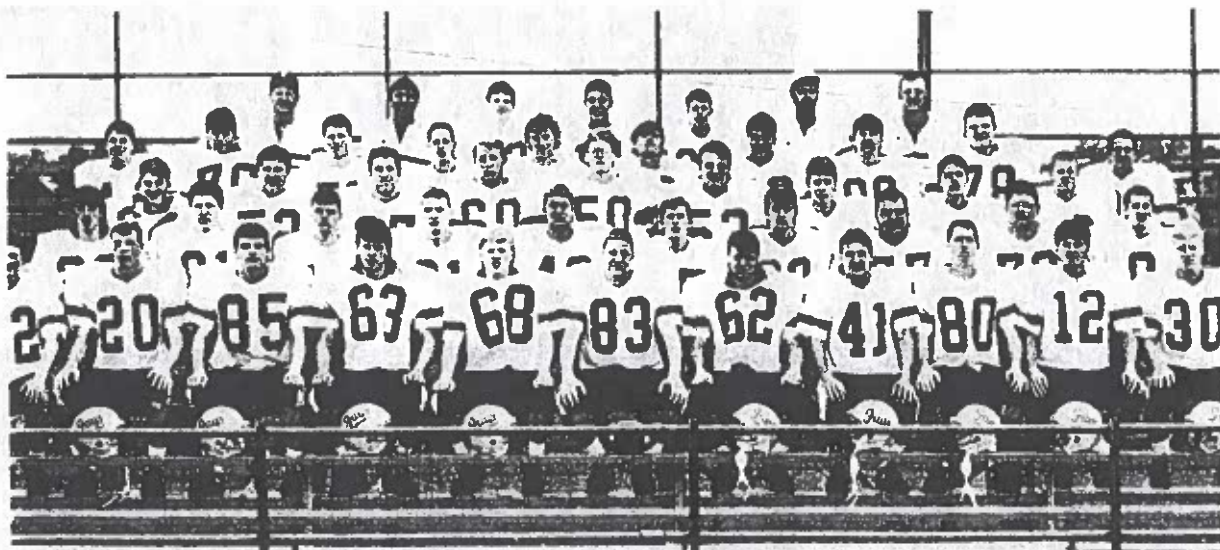
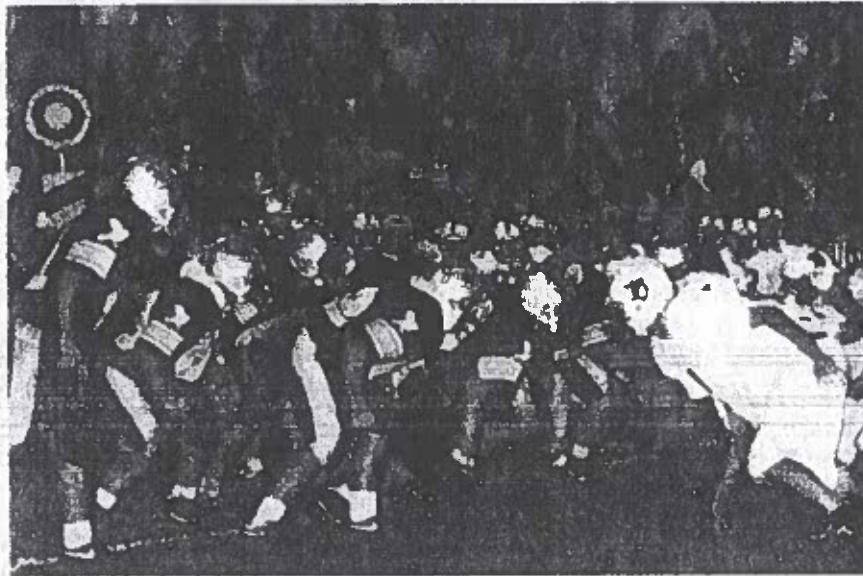

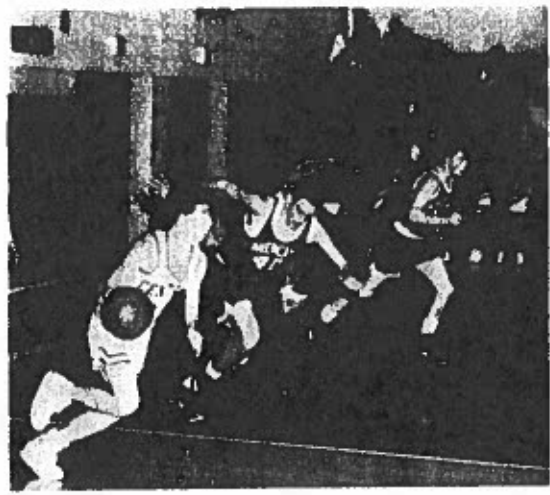
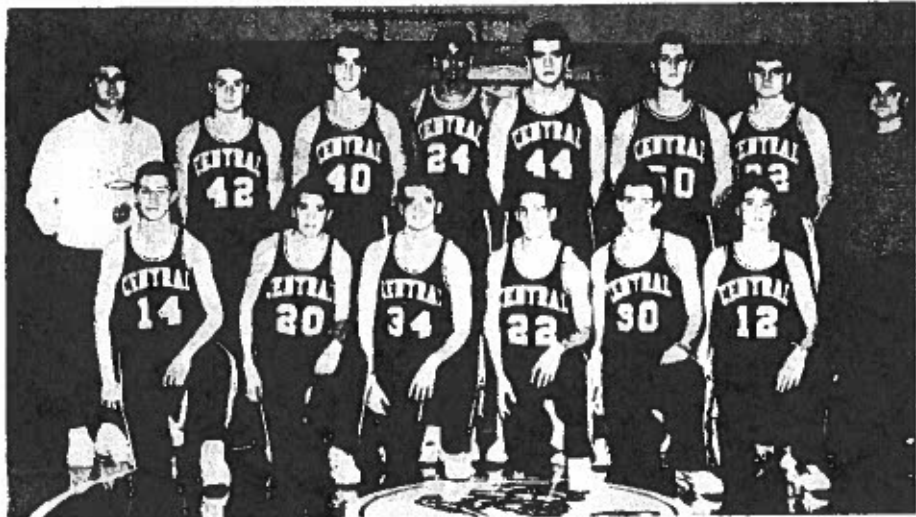
# "Tough Break" Characterizes Blue Jay Season

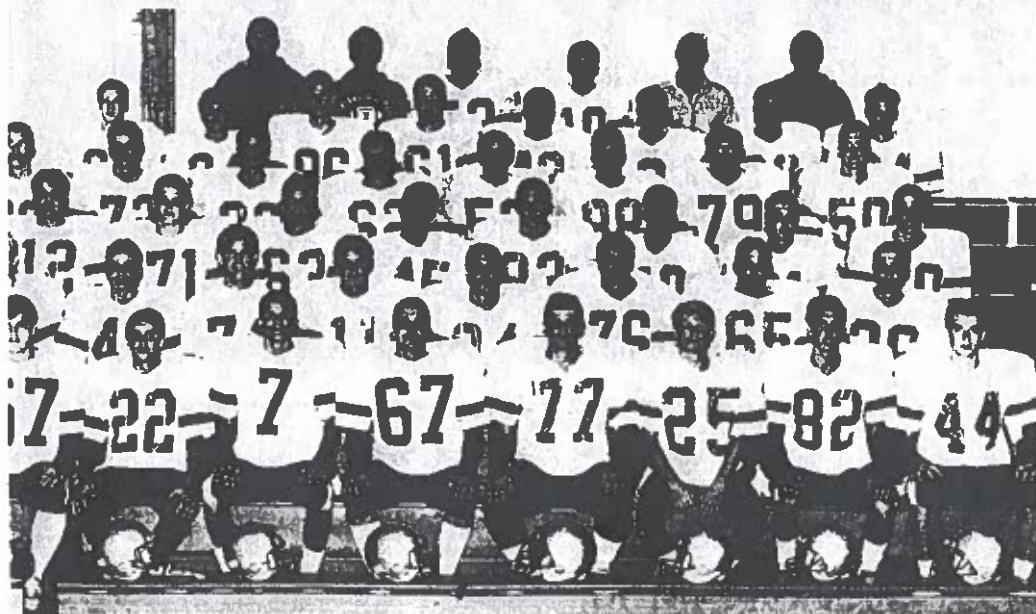
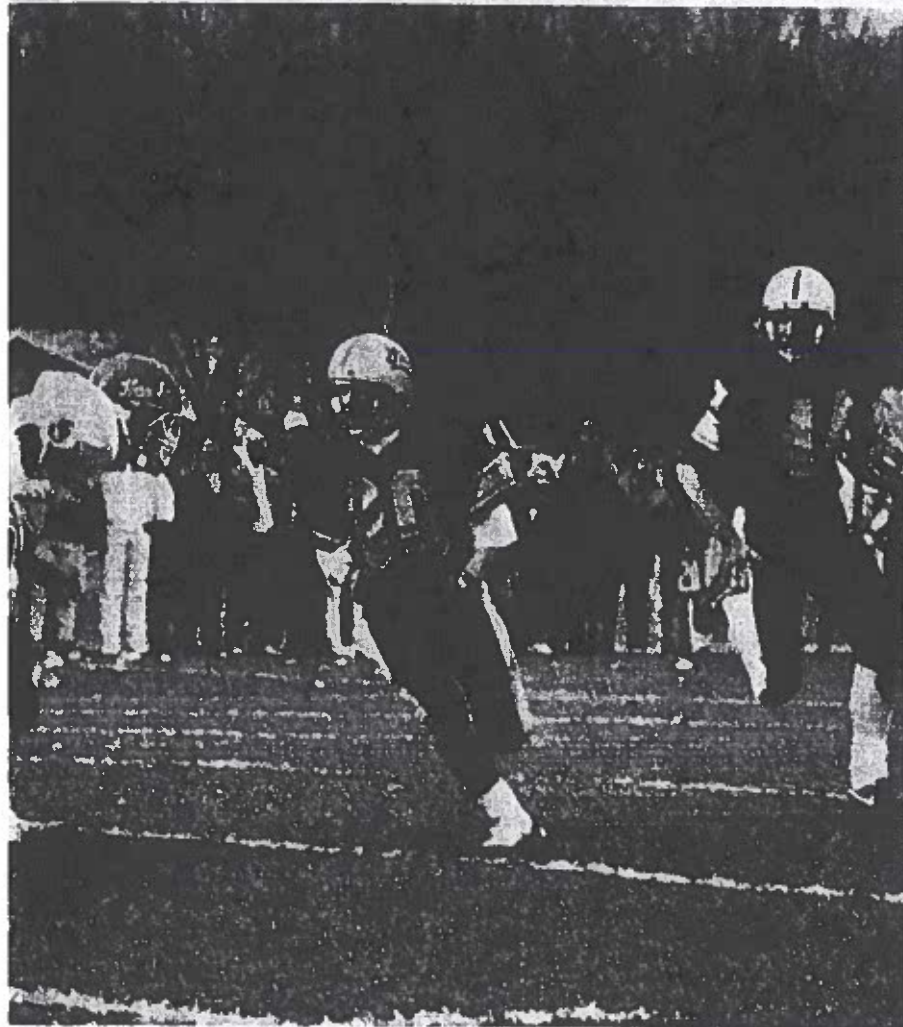


1990 Team a winner

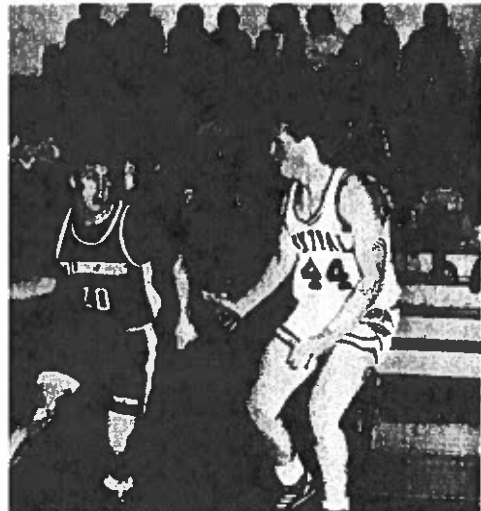
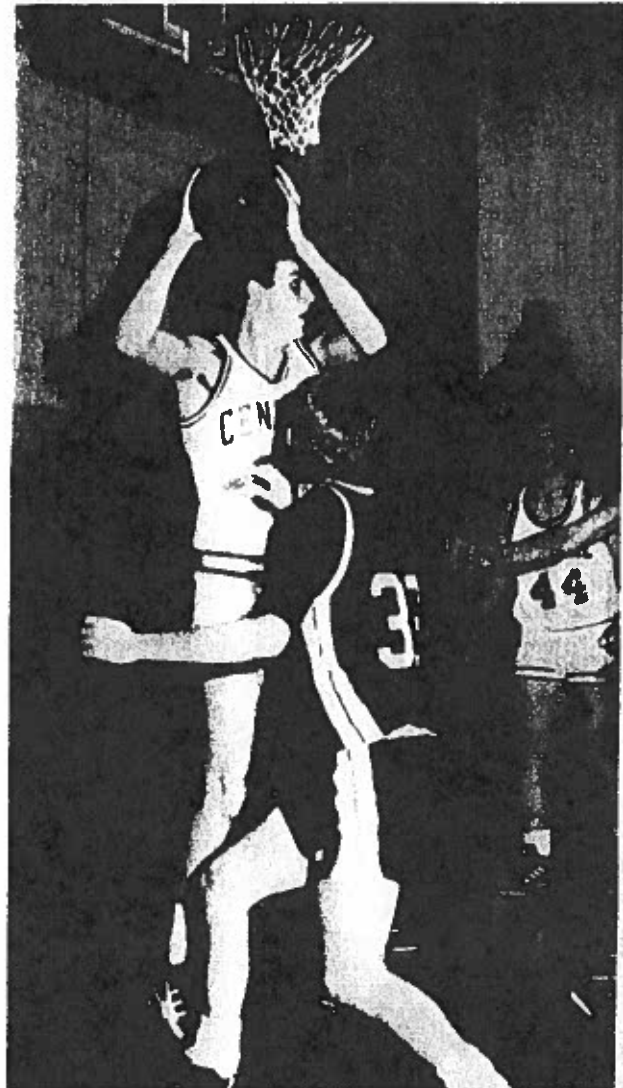

# Bouncing Along the Road to Victory

## CENTRAL COLUMBIA BLUE JAY BASKETBALL.

The 1990-91 edition of the Blue Jays has rekindled a fire that had been smoldering for a few years. Led by a dominating and talented senior class, the charges of fourth year Head Coach Tony DaRe have accomplished what only two other Central Susquehanna Conference teams (Danville 1988-89, Milton 1989-90) have been able to do since the formation of the league — a perfect 14-0 mark. Included in that streak were two nail-biting victories over perennial league power Milton. The first came at Milton when senior co-captain Eric Novak buried a 3-pointer at the end of the third overtime to ice the 59-56 victory. In the second win, in front of a packed house at the "Yastrodome," Milton overcame an 18-point Blue Jay lead only to fall victim once again to a Novak field goal in the closing seconds, securing the 69-68 win. Senior co-captain Brett Sarnoski was also dominating in both Milton games, banging the boards for 17 rebounds in the first and 14 in the second. Sarnoski and Novak have demonstrated tremendous leadership not only by their examples on the floor where Central has been labeled the "team that wins with class," but also as solid students and citizens at Central Columbia. The contributions of four other seniors have led to the most successful basketball campaign since the state championship season a decade ago. Steve Chamberlain and Anthony Rosini have helped make the Jays the best defensive team in the CSC holding opponents to a mere 47.9 points per game. Rob Hippenstiel and Matt Kuhn have provided depth to the talented Blue Jay "5". Anchoring the middle (and the Blue Jay future) is sophomore sensation Shawn McCabe. Shawn's play (12 points and 7 rebounds per game) has been a tremendous boost and one that Coach DaRe says is "remarkable for any player, let alone a sophomore." Add to Shawn some talented Juniors and an undefeated (CSC 14-0) J.V. team and the fire of Blue Jay Basketball will burn brightly for years to come. — Mike Rimsky

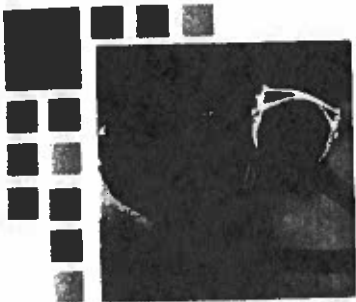

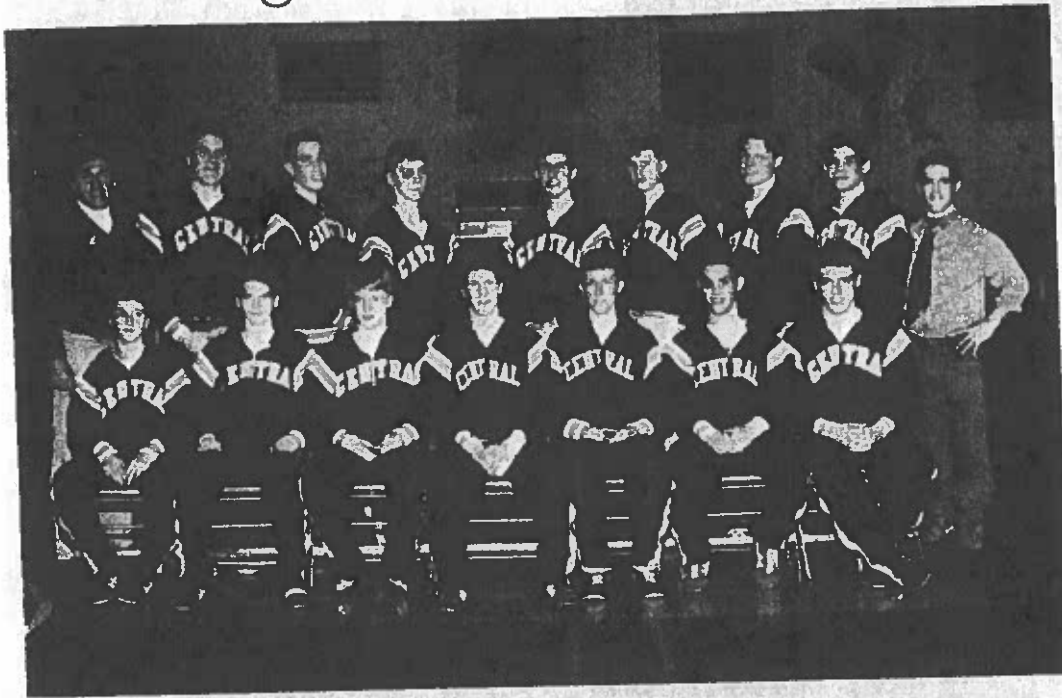
## Todd Cummings Named COACH OF THE YEAR

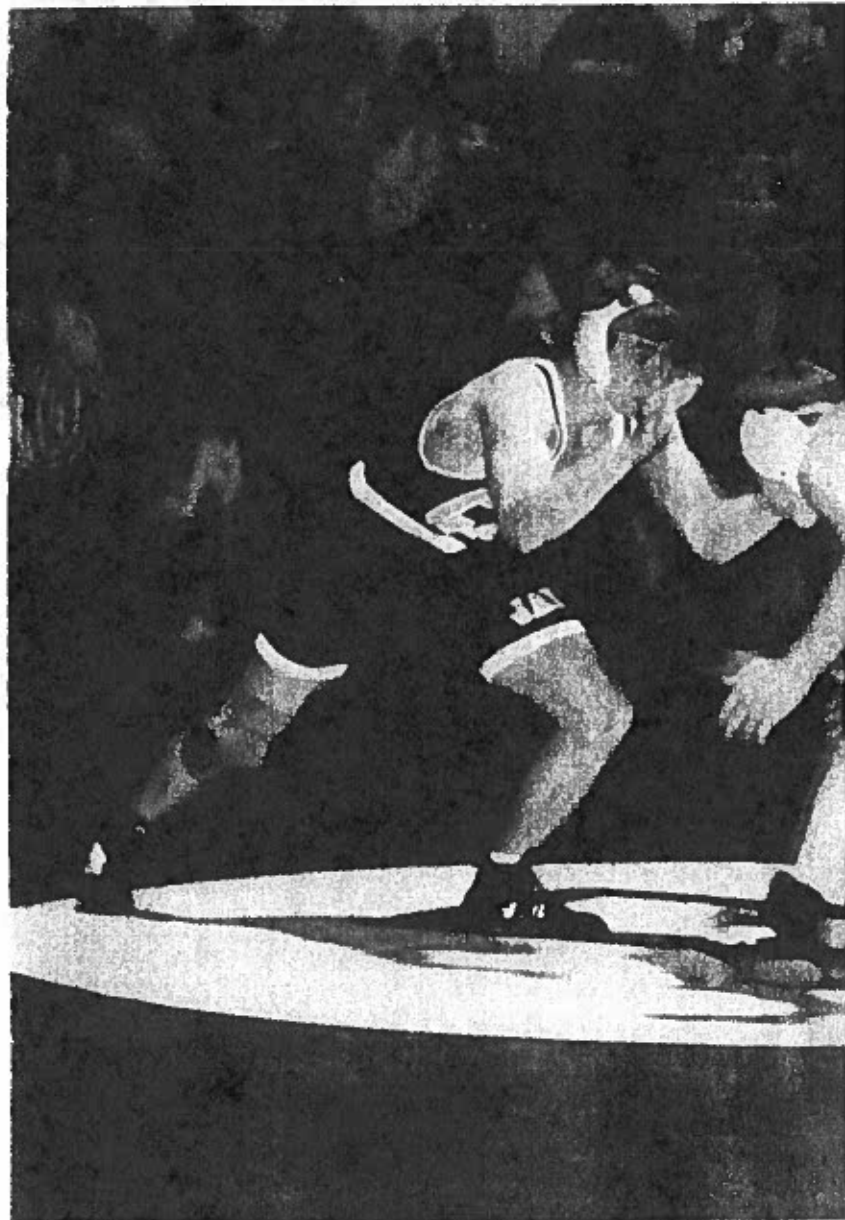
# Wrestlers Surpass Expectations

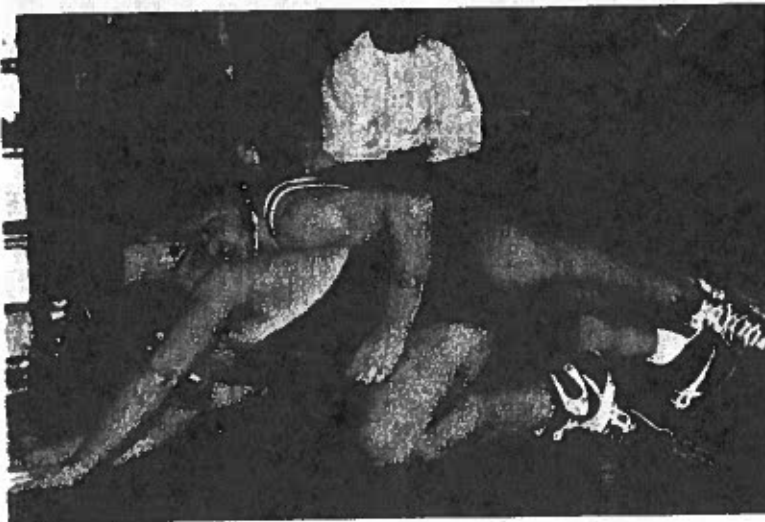

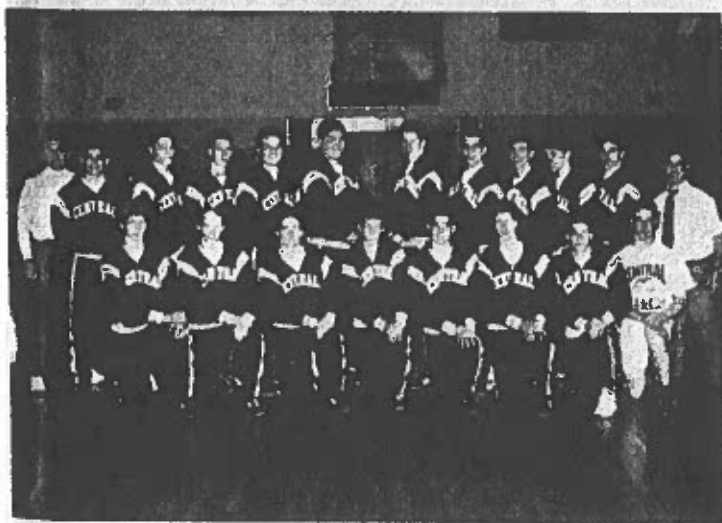


## Central Wrestlers Go For It All!

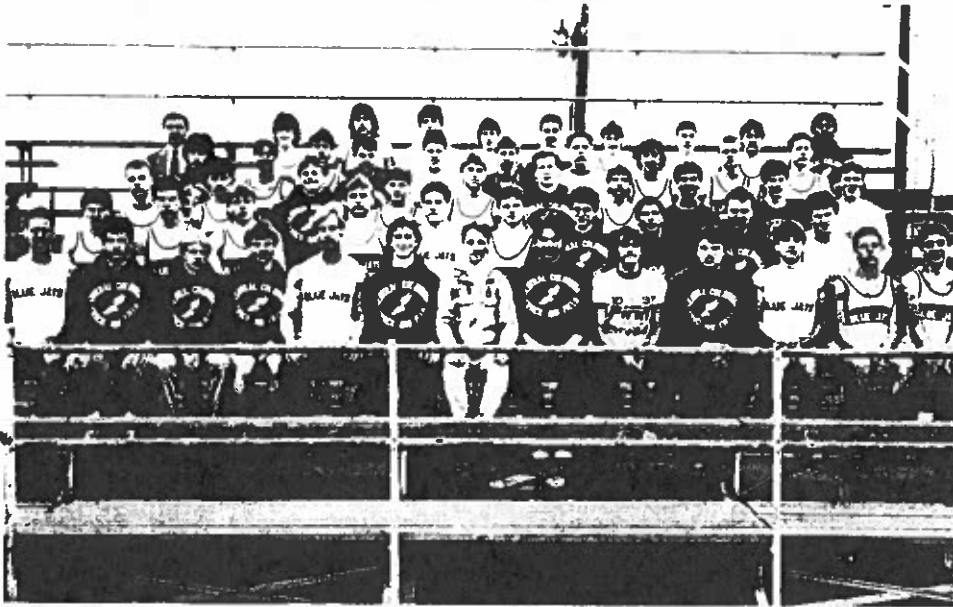
# BOYS WIN 4TH CONSECUTIVE SEASON

Our boys' track and field team completed our fourth winning season in a row. Most of the credit must go to the winning attitude of our seniors.

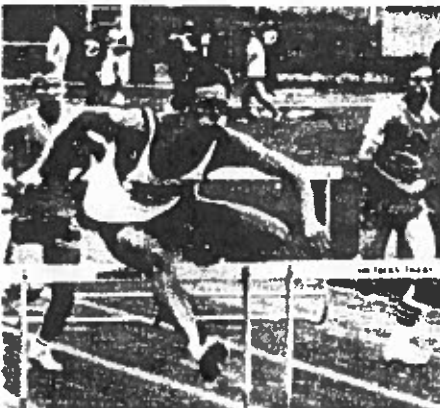

Shawn Devlin led the way in the 400. Shawn was one of the best in the area and he hated coming in second. Shawn was a great competitor.

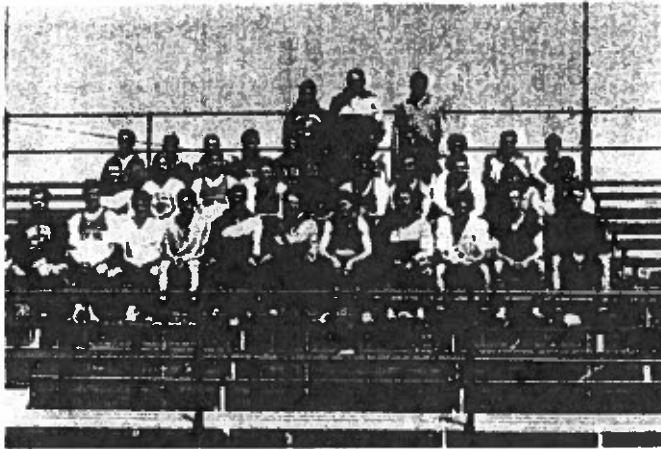
Jared Clossen did a great job for us in the 800. Jared always gave everything he had.

IN QUEST OF A CHAMPIONSHIP

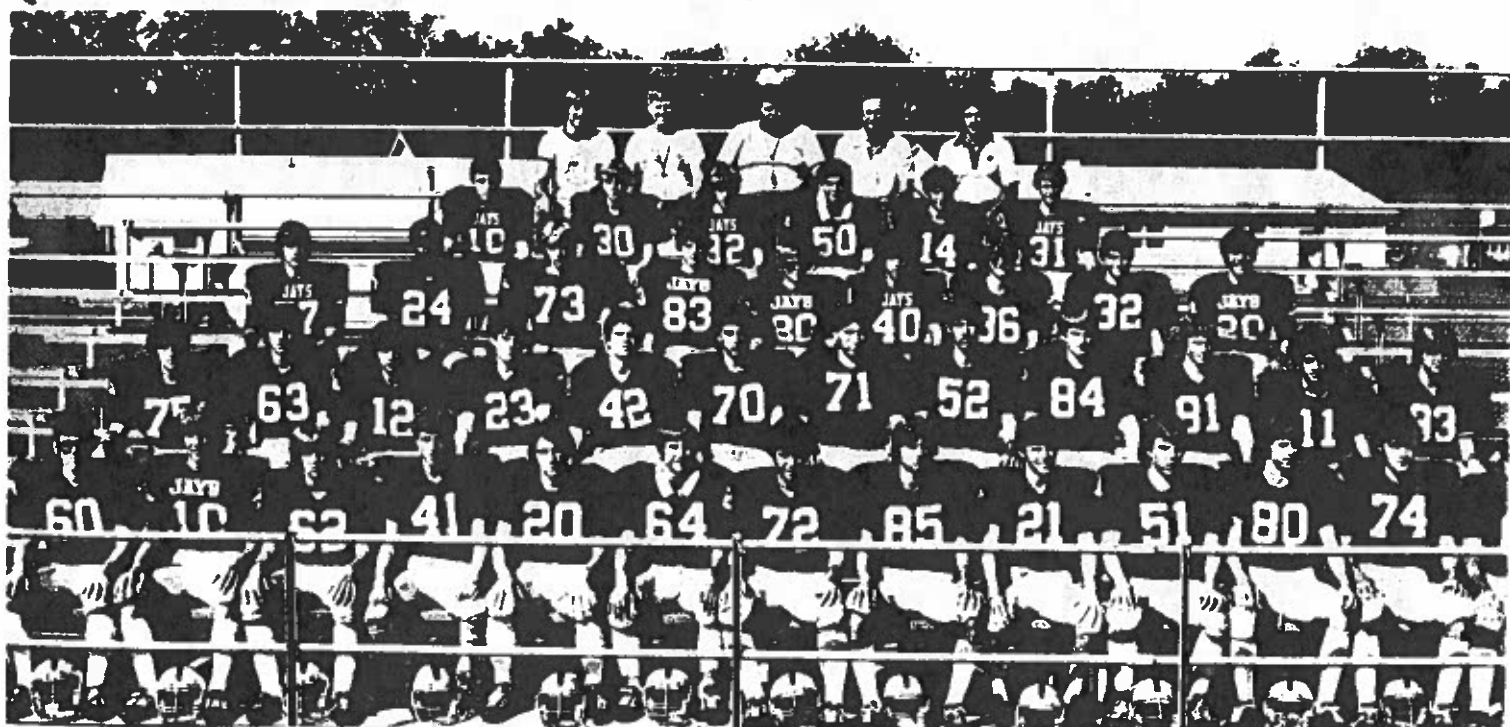

With the help of their

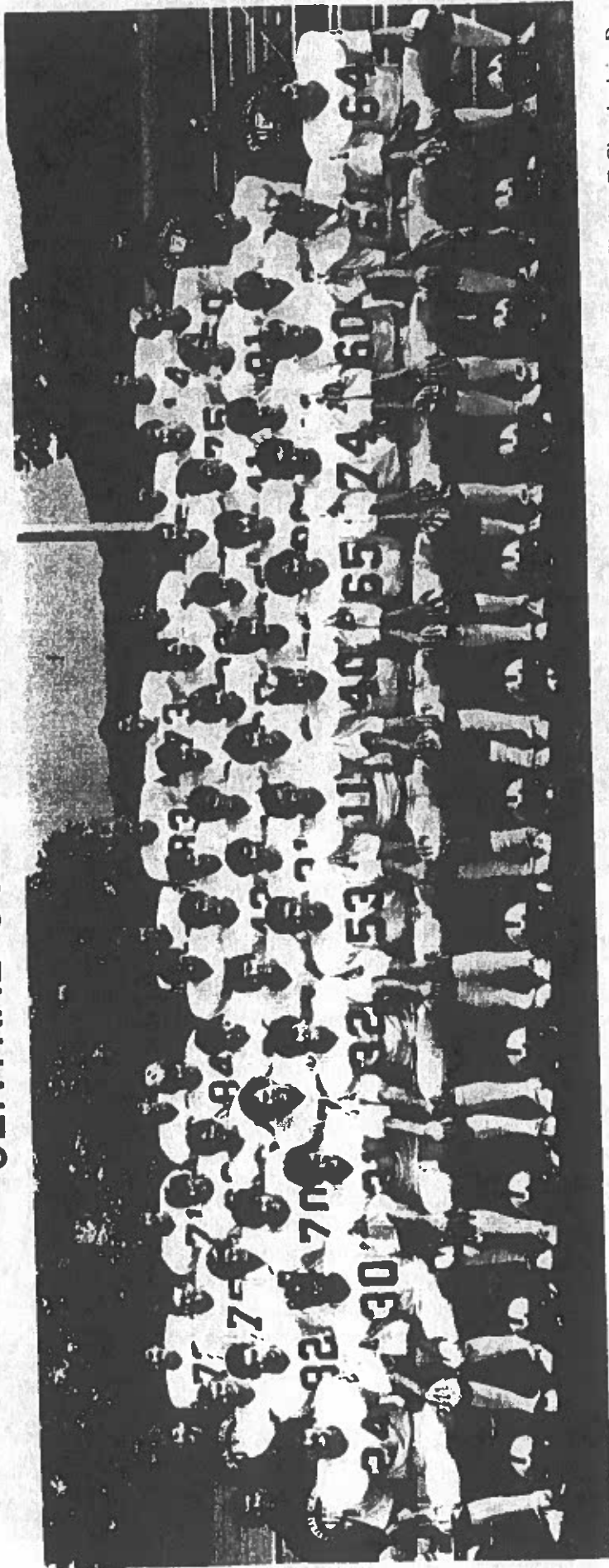
two "thousand yard" backs,

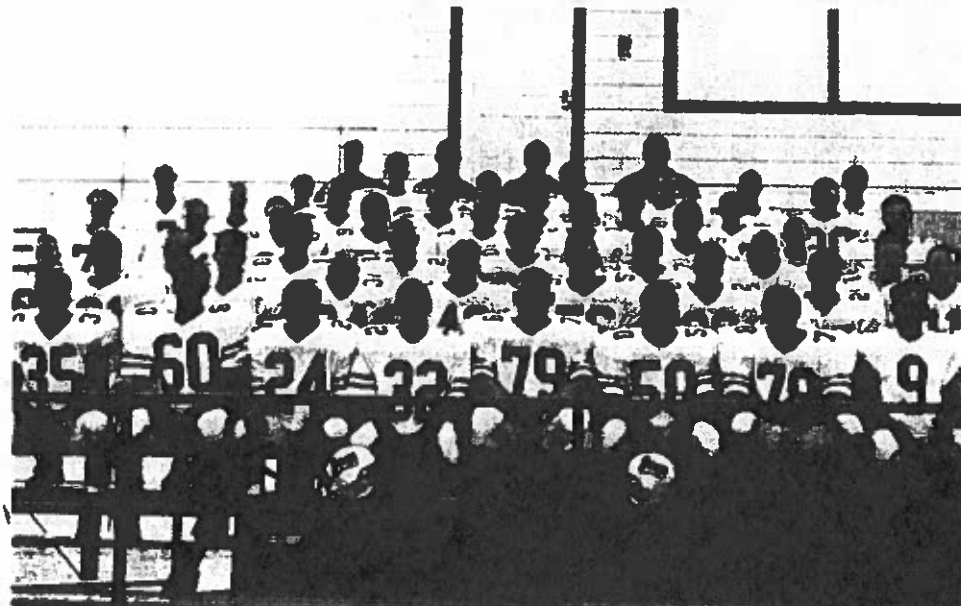

# Blue Jay Football Makes Goal

When the 1994 Central Columbia Football team met for the first day of practice, it set a goal to become the first Blue Jay football team to play in the state playoffs. This was indeed a lofty goal, requiring outstanding play just to qualify for districts (only three teams qualify), then two victories in the district tournament. But it was consistent with the high level of play expected of Central Columbia football teams.

This team did not disappoint anyone. The Blue Jays rolled to an 8-2 regular season mark to qualify as the number one seed in District IV play. The only blemishes were late game defeats to North Schuylkill and Southern Columbia, two teams that finished a combined 26-1. With their goal in sight, the team captured two heart stopping victories in District play. First they rallied with two fourth quarter touchdowns to defeat Western Wayne 28-27. The next week a blocked field goal on the last play of the game preserved a 13-12 victory over Line Mountain to bring home a third consecutive District IV title and a trip to the state playoffs.

Playing on Thanksgiving weekend for the fifth time in six years, the Blue Jays fell to undefeated Cocalico 14-10 in the state quarterfinal. Although the season ended on a down note, this year's senior class was highly successful. The class of 1995 finished with a record of 32-6-1; the most wins of any class in school history. Jake Schlichter, Nick Adams, John Fogarty, Justin Huntington, Joe Crawford, Jeremy Winn, Aaron Rowe, and Jason Bartholomew were all first team Central Susquehanna Conference All-Stars. Seniors Chad Hettler, Ryan Hannas, Jon Leiby, Ryan Bucher, Mike Killian, Tim Roberts, and Frank Arenella were also outstanding performers for this team. In addition, Coach Mathias was named Coach of the Year. Jason Bartholomew set school records for yards in a game, 2093; yards in a game, 354; touchdowns in a game, 5; and four consecutive 200 yard games.

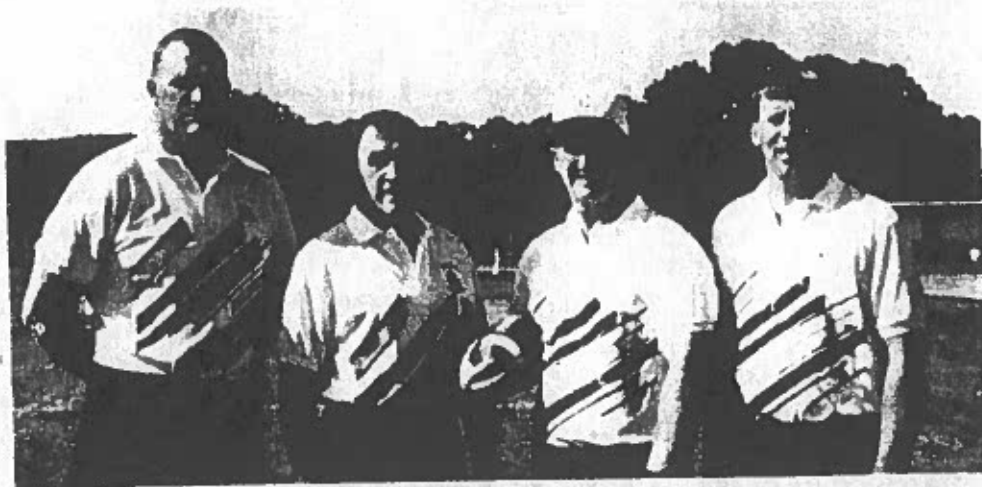

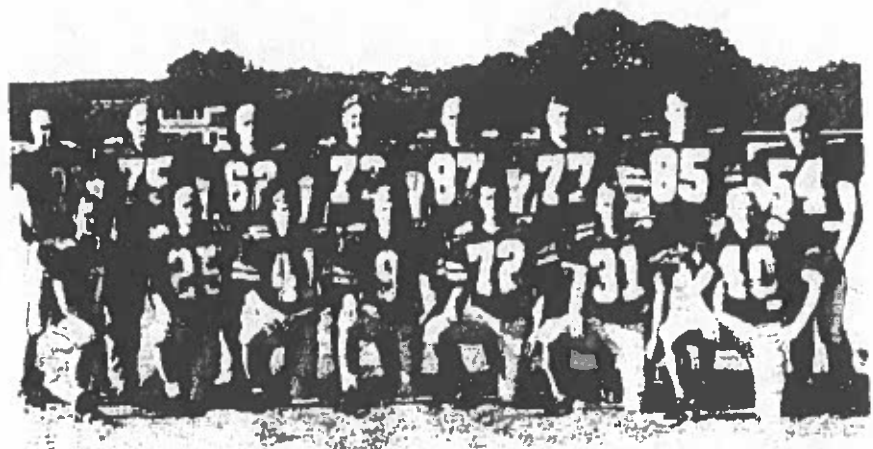
